

Albert B. Ferguson, MD, Receives Third Annual AOA-Zimmer Award for Distinguished Contributions to Orthopaedics

Nominations for Fourth Annual AOA-Zimmer Award Being Accepted

Dr. Ferguson was chairman of the department of orthopaedic surgery and Silver Professor of Orthopaedics at the University of Pittsburgh in Pittsburgh, PA, from 1952 until his retirement in 1986. He also served as president of the AOA in 1976.
